#### **Socialisation**

- The process of learning to behave in a way that is acceptable to society
- Often about being able to distinguish between safe or unsafe, friend or enemy, to eat not to eat, in-groups and out-groups
- Never neutral, becomes absorbed for fast-thinking

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#### **Stereotypes**

- Generalisations about personal attributes or characteristics of a group of people positive or negative
- Grounded in history, politics, social
- Cognitive process of associating a characteristic with a group
- Can be internalised stereotypes we hold about ourselves
- Can affect how we react to people from perceived in-groups and out-groups

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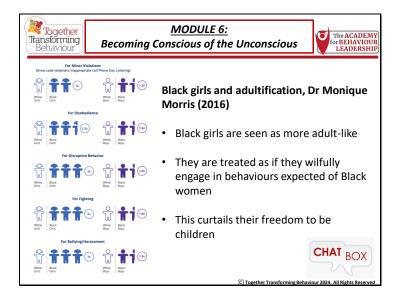
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## Prejudice

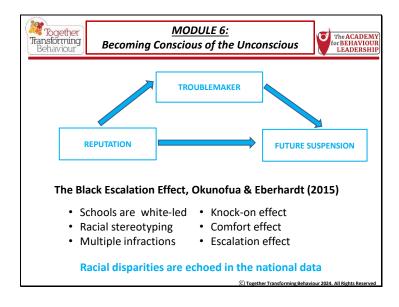
- Stereotypes can lead to prejudice
- Prejudice can lead to unfairness, advantage, disadvantage, harm, perpetuating stereotypes
- Need to lean into bias, slow down, understand where prejudices come from

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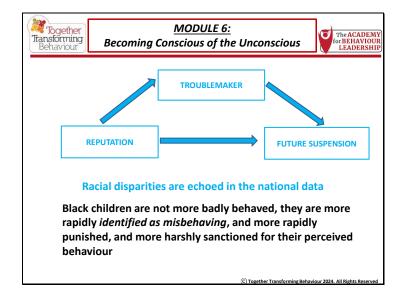



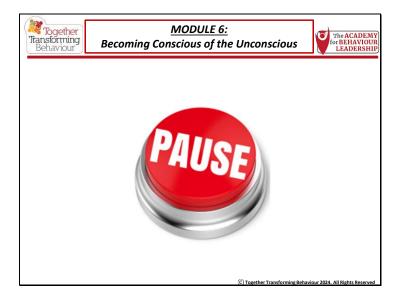

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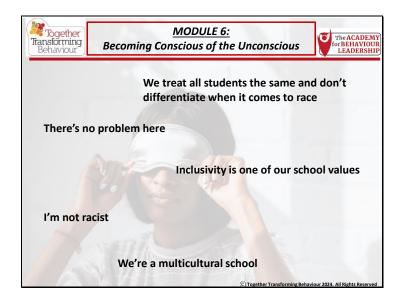
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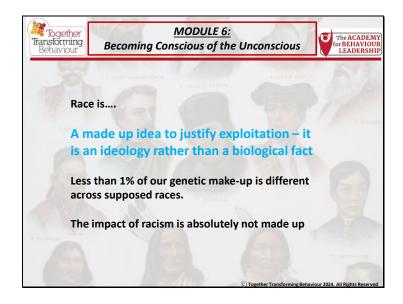


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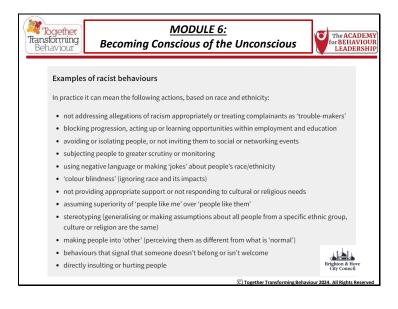

Racism is....when a person is treated worse, unfairly, excluded, disadvantaged, harassed, bullied, humiliated or degraded because of their race or ethnicity.

#### Institutional racism is...

"The collective failure of an organisation to provide an appropriate and professional service to people because of their colour, culture, or ethnic origin. It can be seen or detected in processes, attitudes and behaviour that amount to discrimination through prejudice, ignorance, thoughtlessness, and racist stereotyping which disadvantage minority ethnic people."

How is race and racism baked into the system and how can we practice in ways that are antiracist?

**Racist incidents**: You are not there to decide *if* it was racist. Educate, build trust, restorative instice

**Bullying**: Does our antibullying policy, training and activities with pupils detail our whole-school understanding of racism and racist bullying specifically?

Banter and jokes about race/ethnicity/religion: Stop, ask where that came from, enquire further, unpack together, educate (even if you have to research and come back), reframe, rectors

**Stereotyping & othering:** Do you know what this looks/sounds like? Interrupt, open up don't close down/avoid, give space to understand where these come from and why. "I'm curious to know more about..."

**Children insulting, hurting, excluding or isolating others :** "Please tell me how you feel about what is happening here and why"



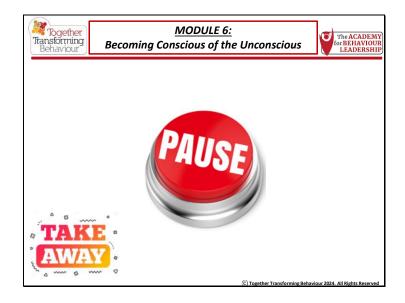

Be aware of how school policy and practice will:

- Block progression, learning opportunities, engagement: streaming, setting, exclusion, exclusion from extra curricular activity
- Not provide appropriate support: the intersection between race and SEND
- Engage in stereotype & othering: Cultural Capital/ EAL/ Language gaps/ Assumptions around FSM/Poverty/Single parent families all baked into edu-speak, Ofsted, DfE expectations

Let's assume we do these things, and try to see how, rather than assume we don't and believe that racists are bad apples and outliers.
